



Sanitizer Labels

Did you know sanitizers CANNOT be reused? This is stated on the label. Sanitizers may be reclaimed and used as pre-rinse water but may not be reused for sanitizing purposes. It is a violation of the label to reuse sanitizers for sanitizing purposes.



- Sanitizers are regulated by the EPA for registration, testing, and approval and FDA for the use of sanitizers on food contact surfaces.
- FDA reviews sanitizer formulations for safety and effectiveness. Non-rinse on food contact surfaces is permitted if used at the permitted concentration according to the label.
- EPA registers the sanitizer, and it is illegal to market a product using sanitizer claims without an EPA registration number. All sanitizers must be registered for use in each state.
